### **SUMMER PLAY LAB**

Welcome to the 2022 Summer Play Lab!

In 2020, Ancram Opera House launched the Summer Play Lab residency as a way to support artists of all practices in the creation of new work in uncertain times. The residency program offered creators a space to make theater that felt rewarding and complete, in a time when live performance was not viable. Through open rehearsals, interactive workshops, and talkback events with the artists, the Summer Play Lab residency forged meaningful connections between resident artists and the community.

As we continue to transition back to live theater, the Summer Play Lab residency remains an integral part of AOH's seasonal programming.

We're trying something new this time! Last year the Summer Play Lab supported the creative team of *SUNWATCHER* (Nana Dakin, Isabella Dawis, and Tidtaya Sinutoke) in moving their beautiful new musical forward. Later last summer, we invited writer-performer Celeste Lecesne to initiate their new play, *POOF!*, as part of our acclaimed outdoor progressive performance, *PLEIN AIR PLAYS*. Recognizing that the creation of new work is often an iterative process, one that can extend over months and years before a piece is fully realized, AOH is thrilled to invite these artists back to Ancram as they continue to develop their extraordinary projects.

Central to AOH's mission is the act of telling stories—whether through spoken word, song or other means—as a way for our community to connect and learn. With the Summer Play Lab program—and this special ongoing relationship with these remarkable theater makers—AOH continues to support visionary artists in their creative journeys and invites the community to take part in the process.

SUNWATCHER
Tidtaya Sinutoke, Isabella Dawis, Nana Dakin,

An experimental chamber musical inspired by classical Noh theatre, *SUNWATCHER* intertwines the story of two women -- the astronomer and "hidden figure" Hisako Koyama (1916-1997), and the Japanese sun goddess Amaterasu.

Hisako was a self-taught solar observer who drew the sun in painstaking detail every day for 40 years, a landmark achievement that ranks among the likes of Galileo. *SUNWATCHER* celebrates this underrecognized Asian woman in science and her extraordinary dedication to ordinary observation.

In World War II Tokyo, despite the threat of firebombing from the US, Hisako looks through her telescope every day and sketches the spots on the sun's surface. Her observations lead her to the sun goddess Amaterasu, a powerful deity besieged by her violent brother. Hisako's experience of war collides with creation mythology, as both goddess and mortal are tested by tragedy and despair.

# The Sunwatcher showing will last about 30 minutes followed by a short discussion

TIDTAYA SINUTOKE (Composer) Tidtaya Sinutoke (ทิตยา สินธก) is a Thailand born, NYC-based composer. Composition credits include HALF THE SKY (The 5th Avenue Theatre's First Draft Commission & 20/21 Digital Season, Weston-Ghostlight New Musical Award, Rhinebeck Writers Retreat, Richard Rodgers Award finalist); SUNWATCHER (The Civilians R&D Group, Weston Playhouse's Songs for Today, Ancram Opera House Play Lab, Rattlestick Playwrights Theater Global Forms Festival); and DEAR MR. C (NYFA's City Artist Corps Grants, Polyphone Festival). She was awarded the 2017 Jonathan Larson Grant, the 2020 Billie Burke Ziegfeld Award, the 2021 International Theatremaker Award and the 2021 Fred Ebb Award. Her works have been supported by the American Opera Project, Composer-Librettist Studio at New Dramatists. Isabella currently holds a 2021-23 Composers and the Voice Fellowship with the American Opera Project. Writers Grove, Rattlestick Playwrights Theater, Ancram Opera House Play Lab, Tofte Lake Center). #### **ABOUT ANCRAM OPERA HOUSE**

AOH offers an annual season of theatre, cabaret, literary, storytelling and community programs.

AOH's theatre productions include *Homebody* (Berkshire Theatre Critics Award for Outstanding Solo Performance); *We're Gonna Die*; *The Brother's Size* (Berkshire Theatre Critics nominations for Outstanding Ensemble and Outstanding Play); the American premiere of *In Praise of Elephants*, *Performing Olana*, an original site-specific piece staged at Olana; *Aunt Leaf*, also presented in Aguascalientes, Mexico and, most recently, reprised as part of Festival Universitario de Teatro, Baja California, Mexico; and the premiere of a new musical adaptation of *The Snow Queen*.

As an incubator of new performance, AOH hosts Summer Play Lab which supports the creation of innovative productions by theatre-makers including Heather Christian and Frank Boyd and presents early editions of new, alternative cabaret performances with acclaimed artists such as Taylor Mac in Holiday Sauce which went on to NYC's Town Hall and San Francisco's Curran Theater, Diana Oh who was subsequently produced at The Bushwick Starr in Brooklyn, and Stew and longtime collaborator Heidi Rodewald in Staged Dives which was then performed at Joe's Pub in NYC.

*Crystal Radio Hour* features new short stories written by Hudson Valley and Tri-state regional writers, including Jo Ann Beard, Wesley Brown, David Rabe and Courtney Maum, that are read by professional actors.

Community engagement is very much at the heart of AOH's programming. Real People Real Stories (RPRS), presented twice a year, features local residents sharing personal, authentic narratives. Local Characters showcases community members in fun, free-wheeling short form conversations. AOH leads storytelling workshops for young people at the Northeast Community Center and 5th and 6th graders at the Taconic Hills School. For adult learners, AOH also offers free writing and theatremaking workshops each year.

#### **AOH MISSION**

Ancram Opera House creates meaningful encounters through the performing arts that forge connection. Through its productions, AOH offers a unique opportunity to directly experience, up close, visionary theatre artists at the top of their field yet seldom seen in the region. AOH's community-based arts and storytelling programs with local residents encourage day-to-day participation in the performing arts. AOH seeks to foster a sense of place for a rural region and contribute to a healthier and happier community.
