The past 18+ months have been undeniably difficult for so many and, at the very least, a lesson in how we can adapt to changing circumstances. For us at AOH, this need for flexibility has brought about some unexpected, silver linings.

Last year, we deepened our commitment to new play development by launching the Summer Play Lab, offered virtually when it was impossible for us to gather in person. Already, AOH has supported over ten artists creating innovative new performance—from this year's team Tidtaya Sinutoke, Isabella Dawis and Nana Dakin making *Sunwatcher*, a multi-layered performance about a Japanese astronomer to Heather Christian's aural odyssey, *None*, presented last season.

This year, we introduce *The Plein Air Plays* which we conceived during the spring when it was still very unclear if indoor, in-person performances would be feasible. While, in the end, it might have been possible to be back at the Opera House, we're so glad to be offering this outdoor theatrical triptych. For it, three artists are creating site specific, bespoke short plays just for you and the setting in which they are taking place.

Most plays take us on a journey; for *The Plein Air Plays*, the experience also includes the travel to each performance location. So, in addition to celebrating the return to live theater, *The Plein Air Plays* builds in time to take in nature. We hope you enjoy the ride!



ABOUT ANCRAM OPERA HOUSE

AOH offers an annual season of theatre, cabaret, literary, storytelling and community programs.

AOH's theatre productions include *Homebody* (Berkshire Theatre Critics Award for Outstanding Solo Performance); *We're Gonna Die*; *The Brother's Size* (Berkshire Theatre Critics nominations for Outstanding Ensemble and Outstanding Production of a Play); the American premiere of *In Praise of Elephants, Performing Olana,* an original site-specific piece staged at Olana; *Aunt Leaf,* also presented in Aguascalientes, Mexico and, most recently, reprised as part of Festival Universitario de Teatro, Baja California, Mexico; and the premiere of a new musical adaptation of *The Snow Queen*.

As an incubator of new performance, AOH hosts *Summer Play Lab* which supports the creation of innovative productions by theatre-makers including Heather Christian and Frank Boyd and presents early editions of new, alternative cabaret performances with acclaimed artists such as Taylor Mac in *Holiday Sauce* which went on to NYC's Town Hall and San Francisco's Curran Theater, Diana Oh who was subsequently produced at The Bushwick Starr in Brooklyn, and Stew and longtime collaborator Heidi Rodewald in *Staged Dives* which was then performed at Joe's Pub in NYC.

Crystal Radio Hour features new short stories written by Hudson Valley and Tri-state regional writers, including Jo Ann Beard, Wesley Brown, David Rabe and Courtney Maum, that are read by professional actors.

Community engagement is very much at the heart of AOH's programming. *Real People Real Stories* (RPRS), presented twice a year, features local residents sharing personal, authentic narratives. *Local Characters* showcases community members in fun, free-wheeling short form conversations. AOH leads storytelling workshops for young people at the Northeast Community Center and 5th and 6th graders at the Taconic Hills School. For adult learners, AOH also offers free writing and theatre-making workshops each year.

Ancram Opera House creates meaningful encounters through the performing arts that forge connection. Through its productions, AOH offers a unique opportunity to directly experience, up close, visionary theatre artists at the top of their field yet seldom seen in the region.
